

Richard D. Urman, MD, MBA, FASA is a staff anesthesiologist at the Brigham and Women's Hospital, a member of Mass General Brigham Health in Boston, Massachusetts, and Associate Professor of Anesthesia at Harvard Medical School.

He is the founding Co-Director of the Center for Perioperative Research and the Director of the Perioperative Medicine and Ambulatory Anesthesia Fellowship.
